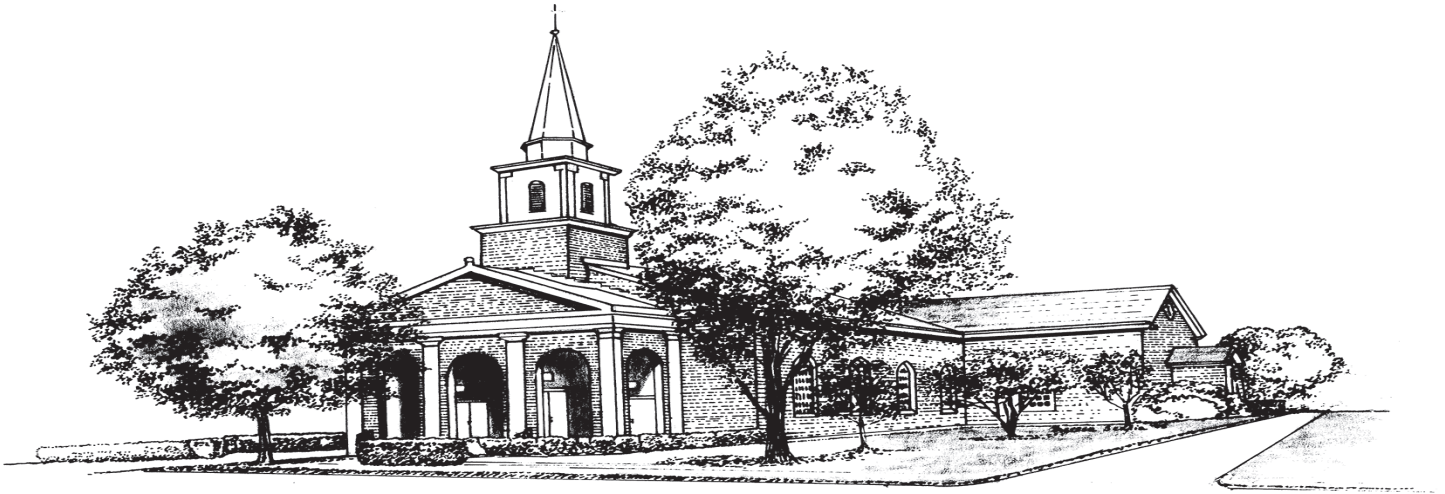

PASTORAL SHARINGS

Dear Parishioners,

Last year our Evangelization Committee sponsored a wonderful series of videos called "Catholicism." These videos were produced by Father Robert Barron, a charismatic priest from the Archdiocese of Chicago who was named Rector of the Chicago diocesan seminary this past year. Father Barron is a prolific writer, educator and communicator, and through his ministry called "Word on Fire" he has responded to the new evangelization which was first introduced by Pope John Paul II and has continued to be emphasized by Pope Francis.

In an article written for Catholic Update, a product of Saint Anthony Messenger Press, Father Barron addresses the question of being Catholic today. He starts by saying that just before Vatican II, at a press conference, Pope John XXIII appeared before a giant globe, and he used, for the first time, the phrase "Lumen Gentium, saying that we, the Church, are meant to be "light to the nations." That became a key teaching of the Vatican Council. Vatican II opened the doors and windows to let that light and energy and power in. It is a power that St. Paul called "dynamis", the dynamic power of the gospel of Christ.

Father Barron points out that Vatican II was meant to take us out into the world, but to some degree we've turned inward in the decades after the Council. We fight among ourselves over many issues, largely about sex and authority. . .but we're not meant to bicker among ourselves, we're meant to be the lumen gentium, the light to the nations. And Father Barron proposes that we will be better Catholics today, a light to the nations, if we understand the great story of our faith as a drama in five acts: Creation, the Fall, the Formation of a People Israel, the Coming of the messiah and today, the Age of the Church.

I'll speak more of these five acts during the hazy, lazy days of summer, and try to tie it all in with the new evangelization which urges us to go out, as a light to the nations, and reflect the light of Christ to those who have let that light grow dim.

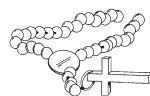

Religious Education Registrations for the 2014-15 Program year:

A **\$25.00 registration fee discount is available to each student registered on or before July 1, 2014.**

The First Eucharist Program is a 2 year process that usually begins in Grade 1. Parents who have a child entering Grade 1 in September are reminded to drop by the Religious Education Office to register their child for the upcoming program year.
