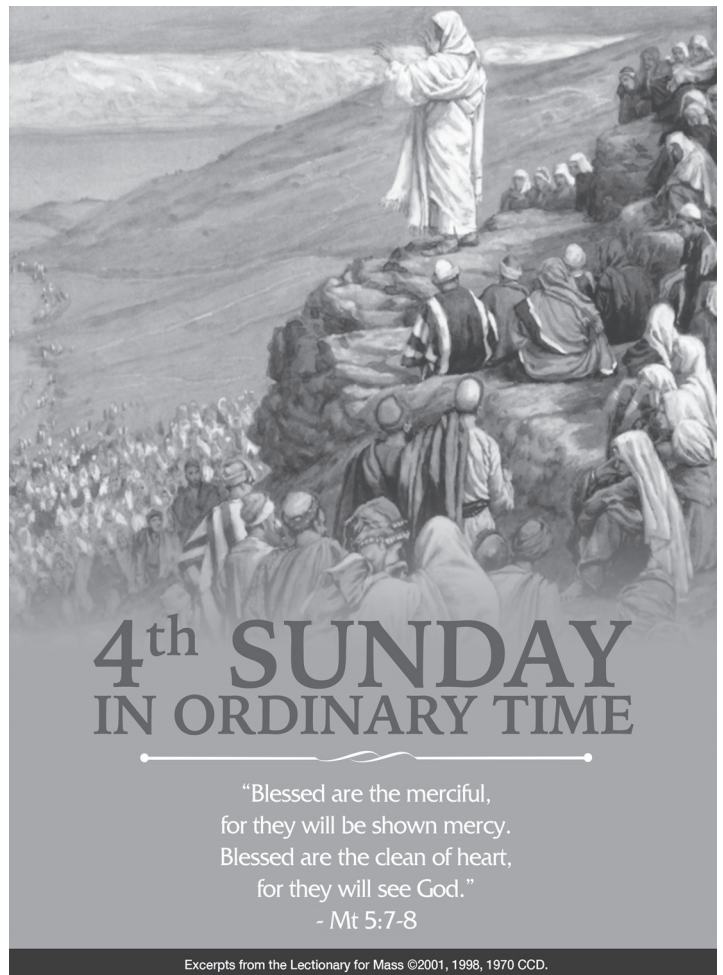

PASTORAL SHARINGS

Dear Parishioners,

Thursday of this week is an important day in the life of the Church, for the Church celebrates the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. In his gospel, St. Luke tells the story of the presentation of Jesus in the temple of Jerusalem. In telling the story Luke emphasizes the Jewish piety of Mary and Joseph, for it was written in the law of the Lord "every first born male child shall be consecrated to the Lord." They carefully do all that the law of the Lord requires because of Jesus' birth. This includes consecration of the firstborn male child, and the purification of the mother after childbirth by offering sacrifice. Luke points out that Mary sacrificed a pair of turtle doves in accord with the dictates of the Lord.

While doing these things, they encounter two people in the temple, a man named Simeon and a woman named Anna. Both are very pious Jews who await the salvation God has promised Israel. The Holy Spirit has revealed to Simeon that he will not die before he sees the Messiah. When Simeon sees the infant Jesus with his parents, he realizes that Jesus is the Messiah. Simeon tells God that he (Simeon) can now die because he has seen the salvation God has promised. All he sees at this point is a baby, but he is confident that this baby will accomplish God's salvation as a light that will reveal God to the gentiles and at the same time give glory to the people of Israel.

Simeon's prayer surprises Jesus' parents. He goes on to say that salvation will not be a simple matter. Jesus will bring about the rise and fall of many in Israel, for people will either accept or reject him. Jesus will be a sign that will be contradicted and a sword will pierce his mother's heart when she sees some people reject her son.

The feast, originating in 4th century Jerusalem, came to be celebrated in Rome by the middle of the 5th century under the title "The Feast of the Meeting." The other reason why February 2nd holds special meaning is because over 200 priests were ordained for the Archdiocese of Boston on that date, including seventy two in my class. Traditionally ordinations took place in June (the newly ordained Father Richard J Cushing came to St. Anthony's in June of 1921), but that tradition was broken in 1952 and for some five years after that ordinations took place on other dates. Please keep my classmates in your prayers as they celebrate their ordination anniversary.
