Dear Parishioners,

From the Middle Ages, with no university in Ireland, young Irish students studying for the priesthood made their way abroad, chiefly to Oxford and Cambridge. From the middle of the eighteenth century, with the beginning of anti-Catholic legislation, there was a shift to the continent, with a group living in Paris as early as 1578. The first Irish college in Spain was founded in 1592. By the end of the eighteenth century prior to the start of the French revolution, the seminarians studying in Europe returned to Ireland to pursue their studies at Maynooth, a small town in County Kildare about 13 miles west of Dublin on the main Galway Road. There, on one thousand acres of land immediately behind the Geraldine castle, the home of Lord Fitzgerald, the Lord of Kildare, the Royal College of St. Patrick was established on June 15, 1795. There, seminarians would be trained for what eventually would become 26 dioceses in all of Ireland, spanning what would become the national border between the North and the South. In 1896 the lay college of St. Patrick was designated a Pontifical University, allowing them to grant degrees equal to the degrees achieved in the great universities of Rome. At that time, St. Patrick's in Maynooth also became a constituent college of the National College of Ireland, joining the national universities at Dublin, Galway and Cork to comprise the one national university.

The main purpose of the seminary at Maynooth was to prepare diocesan priests to serve in the parishes through all of Ireland, North and South. However, on St. Patrick's feast, March 17, 1932, three graduates of Maynooth, inspired by the missionary zeal, Fathers Patrick and Frank Whitney and Father Francis Hickey, established the Missionary Society of St. Patrick with the motherhouse of the society located among the hills of County Wicklow in a town called Kiltegan. Some 14 years prior to that, another missionary society had been founded by a Maynooth graduate named after St. Columban, Ireland's sixth century missionary to Europe. While the Columban Fathers prepared missionaries for Korea and other areas in southeast Asia, the Kiltegan Fathers focused their missionary activities in Africa, in Nigeria and Kenya.

It was into the Missionary Society of St. Patrick that young Liam Scanlan, with seven years of business experience behind him, was accepted and was prepared for the priesthood. He was ordained in 1964 and sent immediately to Nigeria where he would spend the next eighteen years as a missionary. Following that assignment, he became an advocate for the Society, visiting parishes throughout Ireland, and later throughout the Eastern United States appealing for support and prayers for the missions.

Since one of his sisters lived in Dorchester, and now in Quincy, he would help out in parishes in those cities while making his appeals. It was our good luck to invite him to stay with us at St. Anthony some 16 years ago and for these past years and the rest is history. He has become an integral part of our parish life, enriching us with his knowledge of scripture, and ministering to the sacramental life of our parish. But sadly, Father Liam feels that it is time to return to his community in Kiltegan and this week-end marks his final time with us. Please join him after the 11:30 mass on Sunday to bid him God speed. There is a Latin phrase "Fratr, ave atque vale"—"Brother, hail and farewell." Father Liam, thank you for your gift of presence among us and may the God you serve and love so well give you many more years of good health and happiness.
