

## Parish Mission Statement

Dear Parishioners,

We interrupt the sequence of the Sunday liturgies to celebrate this week-end the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. Celebrated by the fifth century by the East Syrians, this feast was inserted into the general calendar in 1457 by Pope Callistus III to celebrate the defeat of the Turks at Belgrade, which was announced in Rome on August 6. The feast occurs forty days before the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross which is celebrated on September 14.

The Transfiguration, when Jesus revealed himself to Peter, James and John atop the mountain, is a singular event in that it is the only time during His mortal life when Jesus permitted His divine glory to shine through His humanity. His humanity is placed in the same sequence by the three evangelists, Matthew, Mark and Luke who recorded it.

The Transfiguration took place about a week after the promise of the primacy to Peter. The high mountain is not identified in the Gospel texts, but a tradition dating back to the fourth century places the Transfiguration on Mount Tabor where there is now a beautiful basilica commemorating the event. As God had appeared to Moses and to Elia on a mountain, so now God in the flesh ascends a mountain to be met by these two representatives of the Old Testament, Moses the law-giver and Elia the Prophet.

During the time of his prayer there on the mountain top, Jesus "was transfigured before them"; that is the glory of His divinity of which he had emptied himself shone through his countenance and his garments. This event was soon to pass away, for the permanent transfiguration could come only through his sufferings, the very topic of conversation between Jesus and His two heavenly visitors. As it was Peter who was the central figure in the context (the promise of primacy, and in the prediction of the sufferings of Christ) so now it is he who speaks for himself and for the others.

Today Mount Tabor is a must see place for pilgrims to the Holy Land, and the importance of the feast is indicated by the fact that it is celebrated as a First Class Feast, even pre-empting the sequence of the Sunday liturgy, replacing the eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary time.

**The Transfiguration of the Lord**

"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him." Oh, to be on that mountain! What a priceless experience for

Peter, James, and John. If they had ever doubted, if they wondered whether Jesus was really who he said he was, their confidence surely got a boost on the day of the Transfiguration.

Before their very eyes, Jesus' divine beauty radiated gloriously while the two ancient prophets also appeared in miraculous manner. And to top it off, the voice of God the Father spoke from the heavens and confirmed that it was all true: Jesus really is the

Son of God!

Why did Jesus reveal himself in such a remarkable way to these men? Perhaps we have an answer in today's epistle. Peter writes,

"We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven while we were with him on the holy mountain." Peter mentions this fact in order to confirm his credibility as a preacher as he goes on to say, "We possess the prophetic message that is altogether reliable. You will do well to be attentive to it." Because of the mission that Peter

had to help shape and nurture the Church in its earliest days, his position as an "eyewitness" to the Transfiguration helped to gain the attention, and the faith, of his hearers.

So although we were not there during this holy apparition, we have the benefit of it. We, and the faithful through the ages, have heard the testimony that Jesus is truly our God from those who saw in person that it was for real. In this way, the Transfiguration is able to bolster the faith of many, not just the three men who were there that day. May we have the grace to allow the feast we celebrate today to truly deepen our faith
